SPRING REGIONAL MEETING Portland, Oregon June 7, 2018





Our Spring meeting will be held in Portland, Oregon in conjunction with the Royal Rosarians of Portland, Oregon. Because of the circumstances in District 5, the executive committee has decided to hold our meeting at the Doubletree Hotel by Hilton, the same hotel where we have stayed in past years. Working with the Rosarians, we have reserved a meeting room for our meeting on Thursday, June 7. The executive committee will meet first at 8:30 A.M. and the general meeting will convene at 10:00 A.M. The uniform will be summer whites - Blue Blazer, white slacks, white shirt, white socks and white shoes. Most people will plan to arrive by Wednesday night.

Breakfast will be available in the coffee shop at the hotel on your own before the meeting. During the breaks we have ordered an assortment of cookies, soft drinks and water. There will not be a charge for the refreshments at the breaks.

We must provide the hotel with the number of people we expect will attend the meeting. To do this Mary Nye Meyers, our Communications Director, has posted a simple link on our web site where members can provide their name, and the number of persons attending the meeting. The form will also appear in our Lighthouse news bulletin. You will be able to send the form to me at the International Operations Center or print it and mail it to me in San Diego, California. Just make sure it arrives in my office by Friday, June 1.

We have mailed the Royal Rosarians brochure to those members who attended the meeting last year. The brochure has also been posted to our web site including the registration form. The brochure has all the details of the weekend including the schedule of events.

For those who have never attended the Rosarian's Hospitality Weekend, here are a few comments on the activities. The event begins on Thursday afternoon in the lobby of the hotel. You will see many Rosarians there to greet you and people to check you in and give you your tickets and a gift bag. In the bag will be a pin for each registered person. That pin will be your entrance to the events as well as the hospitality room on the 15th floor. The Rosarians will have a list of names for all those registered for each event.

On Saturday there will be the Grand Floral Parade. If you want to sit inside (out of the rain) tickets are available with your registration for \$29 per person. I usually lead a group from the lobby of the hotel to the Tri-Met Light Rail across the street. The Memorial Coliseum is three stops down the line.

Some handy hints: If you plan to attend most of the events, it is better to buy the whole package for \$325 per couple or \$165 per person. Portland is a rainy place so bring an umbrella or rain jacket. The Light Rail system is inexpensive and fun to ride. You can purchase a ticket at the airport in the baggage claim area and ride to the Lloyds Center stop and walk across the street to the hotel. If you are 65 or older, you are an "Honored Citizen" and get lower fares.

In Memorium Ray Thompson 2010 International Past President District 8 On June 14, 2017, surrounded by family, Raymond L. Thompson of Palm Coast, Florida, passed away at the age of 101, from natural causes. He was born on December 24, 1915, the son of Winfield Scott and Pearl Maude (Kastorf) Thompson in Cicero, IL. Mr. Thompson, who had a Masters from the University of Chicago, worked in engineering until he retired from FABRI-KAL, a company he helped found, of Kalamazoo, MI in 1981. He drove a Porsche in SCCA (Sports Car Club of America) events and after retiring from driving race cars, he scored races as well. In retirement, Mr. Thompson stayed active in many organizations including the Sons of the American Revolution (past President) on whose behalf he presented Good Citizen Awards at local schools. He was the 2010 President of the International Order of the Blue Gavel as former Commodore of the Palm Coast Yacht Club. Mr. Thompson served as a volunteer for Veteran's Hospital in the Alzheimer's unit. He was a 27 year member of St. Thomas Episcopal Church that included becoming a Licensed Episcopal Minister (LEM). Mr. Thompson was preceded in death by his wife of 56 years Edith (Duncan) Thompson and sister Ailene Anderson. He is survived by his wife of 23 years Dorothy Reid Thompson, son Ray (Carol) Thompson, four grandchildren, seven great grandchildren, and one great grandchild. A Iso he is survived by stepsons Stewart (Frances) Andringa, Reid Andringa, William Reid, five grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

a close up view of the many beautiful waterside homes bedecked with dazzling Christmas decorations.


